CARRYING THE LIGHT OF CHRIST WITHIN THE TEMPLE OF OUR HEARTS

Beloved Saint Nicholas Family,

Throughout the darkening months of December and January we both await the arrival of the Light of the World, Christ our Creator and God, and come to glorify His Incarnation and presence amongst His own creation. The Creator comes to recreate! The Fashioner comes to refashion! The Lord of Lords, King of Kings, and Light of the World unites with His creation, forming them into lights of the world after His own design.

As God-ordained tradition has guided us throughout the centuries, we continue celebrating this blessing with the Feast of our Lord's Meeting at the Temple on February 2—40 days after His birth to the Theotokos, and to all of humanity. In this feast, we find the beloved elder Symeon receiving his Creator and Lord in his own arms as a child, proclaiming Him to be "a light of revelation to the nations, and the glory of your people Israel." In the West, the tradition of this Great Feast of the Church has come to be known as Candlemas, when a procession of blessed and lit candles occurs in honor of the Lord, the Light Himself, coming to the Temple on this celebrated day.

Below we read from a 7th Century saint of the Church, Sophronius the Patriarch of Jerusalem who speaks to this feast and its honoring through offerings of light:

Our lighted candles are a sign of the divine splendor of the one who comes to expel the dark shadows of evil and to make the whole universe radiant with the brilliance of his eternal light. Our candles also show how bright our souls should be when we go to meet Christ.

The Mother of God, the most pure Virgin, carried the true light in her arms and brought him to those who lay in darkness. We too should carry a light for all to see and reflect the radiance of the true light as we hasten to meet him.

The light has come and has shone upon a world enveloped in shadows; the Dayspring from on high has visited us and given light to those who lived in darkness. This,



Let all of us share in its splendor, and be so filled with it that no one remains in the darkness. Let us be shining ourselves as we go together to meet and to receive with the aged Simeon the light whose brilliance is eternal.

Rejoicing with Symeon, let us sing a hymn of thanksgiving to God, the Father of the light, who sent the true light to dispel the darkness and to give us all a share in his splendor.

Through Symeon's eyes we too have seen the salvation of God which he prepared for all the nations and revealed as the glory of the new Israel, which is ourselves. As Simeon was released from the bonds of this life when he had seen Christ, so we too were at once freed from our old state of sinfulness.

By faith we, too, embraced Christ, the salvation of God the Father, as he came to us from Bethlehem. Gentiles before, we have now become the people of God. Our eyes have seen God incarnate, and because we have seen him present among us and have mentally received him into our arms, we are called the new Israel.

Never shall we forget this presence; every year we keep a feast in his honor.

May we all have the Light, Christ our true God, illuminating our lives on this day and always, unto the ages of ages.

President's Message

Greetings everyone and Happy New Year! It is such a blessing that the Philoptochos mission is truly a valued part of St. Nicholas parish! Each event that Philoptochos has sponsored over the past year has been GENEROUSLY supported by not only our parishioners but by visitors to our parish as well. These events see an increase in giving over the previous years. Philoptochos is humbled by the financial expression of your faith in our ability to help those who are needy both within our local area and within the wider orthodox community as well.

Significant activities in January included:

Vasilopeta - On January 9, special loaves of bread (made by our Philoptochos members in the church kitchen), were cut and served to representatives of the St. Nicholas ministries. \$1,886 donated from parishioners for this event will go to the St. Basil's Academy, the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese home in New York for children in need.

Holiday Food Certificate Drive - Every year Philoptochos has spearheaded a project to donate food certificates to families in the community for Thanksgiving and Christmas. This year we helped eight families at four schools, Boze, Blix, Downing and Travis (formerly McCarver), elementary schools. Gift cards were distributed to the families for both holidays.

Our goal was to raise \$4,000 for this project. As of December 31, 2023, we had raised \$4,911, surpassing this goal. Thank you to AHEPA, Daughters of Penelope, and all members of our community who donated to the Holiday Food Certificate Drive.

January/February planned activities to further our mission of helping those less fortunate and to promote participation in the Philoptochos Society:

Soup Coffee Hour - On January 28, members will prepare a variety of soups and rolls to be served at the coffee hour. This will be a free-will offering. Funds for this event will benefit two National funds: the Social Services fund and the Cancer and Other Major Illnesses Fund.

The Social Services fund provides assistance to improve the quality of life of those in need. Through confidential and professional services, the National office provides outreach, education, support, advocacy, financial assistance and referrals to local and broader resources as needed.

The Philoptochos Cancer and Other Major Illnesses fund provides relief to members of our community, so they can focus on their health and health care needs.

Pie Coffee Hour - On February 11 members will serve a variety of pies for \$3.00/piece at the coffee hour. Funds from this event will go to the Autism Assistance Fund. This fund provides assistance and support to persons within the Autism spectrum and promotes education to heighten Autism awareness.

Membership - Our year starts in January and runs through December. The membership is \$30 for the year. Please ask any member about Philoptochos — it is the Orthodox Church's Women's Ministry. FEBRUARY BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

A contract has been signed and materials are currently being procured for roofing replacement over the Upper and Lower Halls, with field work expected to start in early February. The Upper Hall roof is planned to be done first, followed by the Lower Hall roof after the former is completed. Each of the roofs are expected to take about 2 to 3 weeks to complete without factoring in for bad weather, so completion for both is speculated to be around late March or early April.

Chapel renovation work and preparation for new iconography in the Narthex should be done around the time this Messenger comes out. Several small enhancements have been implemented in the Chapel, and most exposed Narthex area wall surfaces have been skim coated smooth over existing rough faced textures, both behind where new iconography will be installed, and above and beyond up to existing ceilings. Unfortunately, the initial time slot for the iconographer who is to install the iconography was lost due to an injury, and he will not be available until a later time, possibly after Pascha, to be determined. Regardless, the walls will be primed and ready, and still act as an improvement over what was previously there.

A contract has been signed with AHBL Engineering to investigate the existing Sanctuary floor structure and produce permit-ready working design drawings that would greatly enhance the floor assembly. If fully implemented the upgrades would provide the church with greater flexibility in what it may want to do in the future in terms of possible further tile flooring enhancements and modifying seating layouts, while taking away the "bounce" one can presently feel when walking across the Sanctuary floor.

The upcoming AHBL design will provide a means to more accurately define what specific scope would be required for a plethora of floor improvement options, which will be used for estimating purposes and help quantify other logistical considerations. Completed design drawings should be ready within the next couple of months, with scope proposals to cost and present afterwards.






The above left photo shows the northeast corner of the Chapel pointing towards the Narthex, where a closet has been removed, and a power outlet and a dimmer switch added. Still left to be done is final drywall finishing and painting. The above right photo shows a rooftop condenser unit over the kitchen area that provides cooling to both a walk-in freezer and cooler below. A side benefit of the re-roofing work is that deteriorated rigid foam insulation wrapped around some exterior refrigerant lines at the condenser will be replaced, allowing the unit to run smoother and more efficiently.

Ministry of Akathist, Prayers for the Departed





On line Donations now possible

ON-LINE DONATIONS

The donation section of the Church's website has been revamped to include a link to a new on-line donation form. The form allows one-time donations, setup for automatic recurring donations, and selection of donation purpose. There is also a note section to inform Church accounting of special handling needs, such as memorial donations or address changes. Church on-line donations are directed to the Church through WePay (a Chase Bank Affiliate) and Aplos Software, LLC. Donors contributing on-line receive an email thanking them for their donation. In addition, through a link in the donation notification, each donor can setup their own Aplos account to view a list of on-line donations, manage recurring donations, and to view and print a contributions statement.

Please be aware that in converting to this software I noticed multiple duplicative account names. In some instances, I will need to merge duplicate accounts so the contribution statement accurately combines into one statement both the on-line donations and check and cash donations. The unique identifier for this purpose is a valid email address.

I want parishioners to enjoy greater flexibility in making Church donations and receiving an accounting of their annual to date contributions at any time of the year. Many of you have asked and inquired about the possibility of accounting for your donations automatically on-line. It is now a reality. If you have any problems or questions with this new service, please let me know. As your treasurer, I am here to serve you!

- Select the (BOK S OF) button. This takes you to the Church's donate page!
- Select the gold colored donate DONATE button at the bottom of the page.
- 4) You will now be taken to the page to make your donation. Simply complete the form.
- 5) From the contributions email you receive, select the link to setup your own Aplos account. An account history page will be available. The first tab will show only on-line donations, the second tab allows accounting for recurring donations, and the third is for contribution statements listing on-line, check, and cash donations.

On Line Services

Watch Services From Home, Live (it's working again)


