My beloved Saint Nicholas Family,

Under the prayerful leadership of the most blessed and ever-virgin Mary, the myrrhbearing women faithfully hastened not only to the tomb of our resurrected Lord, but first faithfully hastened to His life-giving ascent upon the Cross. When the threat of capture by the Jews and Romans overwhelmed the Disciples, the myrrhbearers persevered with prayerful intention and courage that can only be given by the Lord and Creator Himself.

There are times in our life when fear of the unknown can be debilitating. While our physical actions may seize, our mind is no-less busy with thought after thought, temptation after temptation. The purposeful movement of the myrrhbearers to the Crucifixion of our Lord, in choosing to not abandon Him on that most-precious and life-giving Wood, they prepared themselves to receive a gift from the Gift-giver Himself, the gift of life. If we think even for a moment that those brave women did not battle the same temptations and intrusive thoughts that debilitate us, we would be mistaken. So what was different? They chose life. They chose to receive from the Giver. In, and certainly through, their own weaknesses, they simply "showed up"-they made themselves present to the Creator and Lord.

While the majority of the Disciples abandoned Him in that hour, there was one faithful servant who did not: Saint John the Evangelist. In his presence at our Lord's final hour, he joins the myrrhbearers in representing faithful humanity—those that prepare to receive from the Giver. On our own, we can do nothing, but with the grace of God, who seeks to give to each of us, we are united with Him in our first-calling. With the Evangelist and Panagia side by side, our Lord unites the faithful of all ages as family: "Woman, behold your son," and to us: "Behold, your mother."



President's Message

Greetings everyone! It is such a blessing that the Philoptochos mission is truly a valued part of St. Nicholas parish! The events that Philoptochos has sponsored over the past year have been GENEROUSLY supported not only by parishioners, but by visitors to our parish as well. Our events have consistently seen an increase in giving over the previous years. Philoptochos is humbled by the financial expression of your faith in our ability to help those who are needy in our local area and the wider orthodox community.

Significant activities include:

Palm Sunday Dinner - Philoptochos hosted the Palm Sunday dinner on April 28th serving cod, baked potatoes, coleslaw and pineapple Lenten cake. The parish council will cover the cost of this event. In addition, \$1,000 will be sent to Hellenic College/Holy Cross Lenten Event fund, which goes to the operating expenses of the school.

Recent activities to further our mission of helping those less fortunate and to promote participation in the Philoptochos Society:

MAY BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

Roofing tear-off and replacement work started in April. At this time, both the Lower Hall and Upper Hall roofs are completely "in the dry". This means new roofing membranes are installed and in place. At this point, the new roof should be able to withstand the nastiest of rainstorms without the worry of a leak occurring.

There are still odds and ends that need to be completed; most noticeably, the installation of new top perimeter sheet metal flashings. The rest of the work: making up a punch list, a final walk-through, getting the building permit signed off, and taking care of other administrative obligations will likely carry into May. This should not intrude on or interfere with the upcoming Holy Week and Pascha.

A preliminary estimate was presented to the Building Committee last month to upgrade the flooring and floor structure in the Nave. This includes filling in the recessed pew areas with either vinyl plank or porcelain tile flooring, providing seismic improvements, and beefing up the floor structure which would increase its load bearing capacity and eliminate the "bounce" when walking across the space. It was decided to further fine-tune and clarify the estimate scope before presenting to the Parish Council. This will be done in the upcoming month after being further reviewed by the Building Committee.








The two upper photos show the removal of existing roofing at the Lower Hall and Upper Hall roofs respectively. Surprisingly the existing plywood sheathing underneath was in much better shape than anticipated, with very little dry rot discovered despite several of roof leaks experienced over the years. 



On line Donations now possible

ON-LINE DONATIONS

The donation section of the Church's website has been revamped to include a link to a new on-line donation form. The form allows one-time donations, setup for automatic recurring donations, and selection of donation purpose. There is also a note section to inform Church accounting of special handling needs, such as memorial donations or address changes. Church on-line donations are directed to the Church through WePay (a Chase Bank Affiliate) and Aplos Software, LLC. Donors contributing on-line receive an email thanking them for their donation. In addition, through a link in the donation notification, each donor can setup their own Aplos account to view a list of on-line donations, manage recurring donations, and to view and print a contributions statement.

Please be aware that in converting to this software I noticed multiple duplicative account names. In some instances, I will need to merge duplicate accounts so the contribution statement accurately combines into one statement both the on-line donations and check and cash donations. The unique identifier for this purpose is a valid email address.

I want parishioners to enjoy greater flexibility in making Church donations and receiving an accounting of their annual to date contributions at any time of the year. Many of you have asked and inquired about the possibility of accounting for your donations automatically on-line. It is now a reality. If you have any problems or questions with this new service, please let me know. As your treasurer, I am here to serve you!

- On a computer or mobile device, go to the Church's website <u>www.stnicholastacoma.org</u>
- Select the (BOK S OF) button. This takes you to the Church's donate page!
- Select the gold colored donate DONATE button at the bottom of the page.
- 4) You will now be taken to the page to make your donation. Simply complete the form.
- 5) From the contributions email you receive, select the link to setup your own Aplos account. An account history page will be available. The first tab will show only on-line donations, the second tab allows accounting for recurring donations, and the third is for contribution statements listing on-line, check, and cash donations.

Watch Services From Home, Live (it's working again)


